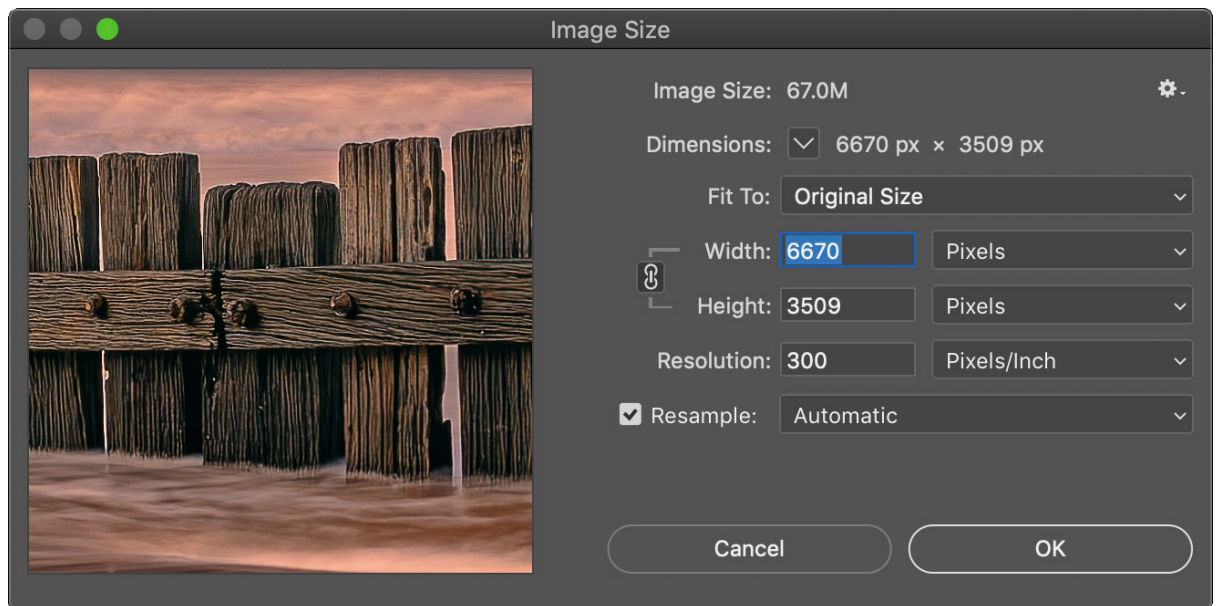


Resizing an Image in Photoshop

1. Open your image in Photoshop.
2. Choose **Image / Image Size** and the Image Size dialog box will appear.



3. Make sure that **Fit To** is set to **Original Size**.
4. Make sure that the grey lines joining the **Width** and **Height** fields via the **Chain Link** icon are present, if they are not, click the **Chain Link** icon and they will appear. This ensures that the aspect ratio of the image is maintained as you alter the **Width** and **Height**.
5. Make sure that the **Units of Measure** for both **Width** and **Height** are set to **Pixels**.
6. Make sure that **Resample** is ticked.
7. Make sure that the **Interpolation Method** (next to **Resample**) is set to **Automatic**.
8. If the width is greater than 1920 pixels, change the **Width** field to 1920. The figure in the **Height** field will change accordingly.
9. If the height is still greater than 1080 pixels, change the **Height** field to 1080. The figure in the **Width** field will change accordingly.
10. Press **OK**.
11. Choose **File / Save As**, in the File Save As dialog make sure that you change the filename to avoid overwriting your original file, make sure the **Format** is set to JPEG and press the **Save** button.
